



SCFA Offers Free Virtual Workshop: Accreditation – Facts & Myths

The South Carolina Fire Academy is hosting a free *virtual* workshop centered around the value and process of earning fire department accreditation through the Commission on Fire Accreditation International.

Achieving international fire department accreditation through the Center for Public Safety Excellence is a long journey for any fire department. The most common fears tend to be centered around money and time.

Learn from experienced accreditation managers as they sort through common myths about the accreditation process, provide facts, and answer questions. Segments include knowing when you're ready to start the process, managing the extra accreditation work, and anticipating and overcoming obstacles.

To encourage active participation, attendance is limited. If you are an accreditation manager, be prepared to share advice. If your department is on the path to accreditation, or it's in your long-term plan, here's your chance to ask questions. Other attendees can learn about self-assessment tools and how they can better your fire department, even without the third party verification.
