



Firefighter Fatality Protocol: What to Expect and How to Prepare

The South Carolina Fire Academy is hosting a free three-hour workshop to help fire departments understand what happens after a firefighter fatality and the steps to prepare for such a tragic event. Fire Department personnel may wonder - What happens in the first hour after a fatality, the first four hours, even the first day? Although no department wants to endure this type of tragedy, departments must be prepared for what happens next.

By having updated protocol in place, a department will know what to expect during one of its most stressful and difficult times. Detail will be given addressing the multitude of investigations that occur and what to expect from each one. Missteps and obstacles that have been encountered in past firefighter fatalities investigations and lessons learned will also be covered. Finally, an investigative "triage" sheet will be shared that offers steps and roles that need to be fulfilled during such an event.
