The South Carolina Fire Academy is partnering with Greenville City Fire Department (Greenville County) to offer a free two-hour virtual workshop discussion focusing on high-rise or mid-rise firefighting.

Fire ground operations on residential structures are the routine fire call that most departments encounter. However, there is a large hurdle when elevation is added within a high-rise or mid-rise firefighting operation. This could be a true high-rise in

a downtown district, or it a three-story hotel in a rural area. Regardless, tactics must change to produce the same outcome that is expected on the routine fire call.

This presentation covers the basic first due tactics that must be implemented to have a successful outcome during a high-rise or mid-rise incident. Without proactive training for these types of fires, the results could be disastrous. Realistic fire ground training is necessary for the benefit of the citizens, our departments, and our communities.
