

Truck Company Operations: What Everyone on the Fireground Should Know



The South Carolina Fire Academy is partnering with Summerville Fire Department (Dorchester County) to offer a free virtual workshop discussion focusing on truck company operations.

Fireground operations can be boiled down into two main areas of work - Engine or Truck. Not every fire department runs a true “Truck Company,” but this work still must be accomplished. The strategies and tactics used to accomplish this work vary and are, at times, driven by factors such as geographic location, staffing, apparatus availability, and experience.

Whatever the case may be, Truck work is vital to fireground success. This workshop will cover the basics of Truck Operations and how any department, regardless of size, can successfully accomplish this work in order to complete the mission. The interactive three-hour discussion will include tips for short-staffed departments, and provide examples of how larger departments operate in order to be successful. Learning from one another is the best way to grow and ultimately save the lives of those we protect.
