



Firefighter Mobilization Oversight Committee December 11, 2008 State Fire Marshal's Office

- Chairman Reich called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone.
- Minutes from the June 2nd meeting were read and approved.
- Dan McManus presented the US&R Director's report. (See Attachment 1)
 - o Bruce Kline made a motion to accept the report, seconded by Alvin Payne, motion passed.
- Jason Pope presented the Mobilization Coordinator's report. (See Attachment 2)
 - Karl Ristow made a motion to accept the report, seconded by Alvin Payne, motion passed.

Old Business

- FFM Strategic Plan Karl Ristow had not report.
- Libby Hardwick passed out the budget update.
 - Alvin Payne requested the Fire Marshal's Office provide a US&R Budget request to the Firefighters' Association for submittal during the 2009 General Assembly.
 - o Bruce Kline made a motion to accept the budget as presented, motion was seconded by Tommy McDowell, motion passed.
- Ed Roper reported the new US&R building has been completed and turned over to the division. Ed further stated the project's total cost is estimated at 2.5 million dollars. The building is approximately 22,000 square feet in size.

New Business

- Dan McManus submitted a quote for additional radio equipment to be installed in the response vehicles.
 - o Alvin Payne stated we should include the radio equipment in our State Homeland Security Grant request instead of paying out of our budget.
- John Reich briefed the committee on this year's Homeland Security Grant requests. There were 137 requests submitted to DHS from our state. DHS awarded the state 9.3 million dollars, 80% of which goes to local projects and 20% goes to state projects. Columbia FD requested \$288,000 for a regional US&R team and was awarded \$144,000. LLR requested \$723,000 for the US&R program and received \$415,000.

Open Discussion

- Karl Ristow passed out copies of the Charleston City FD Backfill After Action Report. He commentated that everything went well during this response.
- Alvin Payne requested more information on the workers' compensation and liability issues facing the US&R team so he can brief the Firefighters' Association.

The next meeting date was not determined.

Mobilization Coordinator's Report December 11, 2008

- 1. To date, we have **240** registered fire departments with **4,402** personnel.
- 2. State Fire Project FY07 Equipment has been purchased and distributed. This completes the FY07 project. The following departments received the equipment and manufacturer-authorized training: Anderson City, Aiken County, Beaufort, Clarendon County, Colleton County, Columbia, Greenwood, Hartsville, Lancaster, Midway and Spartanburg County.
- 3. The SEMS ID card project has been completed. An ID card-printing function has now been integrated into SEMS, and we have begun printing cards with a fireTRAX barcode included. We can also send emails from SEMS to all registered users. Additionally, all registered region administrators can now view and update SEMS Requests, whereas before, only system administrators had access to that information.
- 4. Fire Marshal's EOC two new laptops with docking stations were added to the EOC for use during the planning and response to activations.
- 5. Response to Charleston FD (June 18, 2008) Firefighter Mobilization assisted the Charleston FD by staffing city stations on the one-year anniversary of the Charleston 9 tragedy. FFM staffed six stations and the remainder was staffed through county mutual aid.
- 6. S.C. EMD called a meeting of key state agencies to discuss credentialing of first responders. Dan McManus and I attended that meeting; there was much discussion about various issues and no action was taken. EMD received a homeland security grant to hire a credentialing coordinator to head up this project.
- 7. SLED Information and Intelligence Center we were approached by SLED about staffing a position at the Information and Intelligence Center (formerly the Fusion Center) on behalf of the fire service. Dan McManus and I received training on center operations and were issued SLED credentials to give us access to the building. Between the two of us, we try to spend at least one day a week at the center.
- 8. IAFC Grant the PO has been created to include the required amount and we are in the process of being billed for the programming services. Once we have received an invoice, the PO will be billed, and we seek reimbursement from the IAFC grant program.
- 9. In October, at the request of Charlotte FD, we hosted a Fire Chiefs' group from the United Kingdom and provided them with a tour of the Fire Academy, SLED Information Center and the State Emergency Operations Center. The tour went extremely well, and the group was impressed with our state's facilities.
