- Identifying the legal issues affecting the training function, including an understanding of a standard of care and the impact of OSHA and NFPA standards,
- Safety considerations in training,
- Marketing training internally,
- Identifying ways to justify training needs,
- Resolving training conflicts using appropriate conflict resolution techniques,
- Selecting and evaluating training curricula and materials from outside sources, and
- Effective delivery and evaluation of training.

This course can be for the department that desires a higher level of chief officer training. Special emphasis is placed on firefighter safety.
