



The Firefighter Rescue Survey: Using Real Life Data for Real Life Decisions

Data points from the <u>Firefighter Rescue Survey</u> (FFRS), an on-going voluntary survey created by veteran firefighters for a singular purpose – to save lives, will be discussed during this two-hour virtual workshop. Specifically, the first 3,000 survey response results (from more than 50 compiled questions) will be shared that should drive future Incident Commanders' decisions in real time on the fire ground.

This workshop will also present the need to update and tailor basic and advanced training methods and techniques using FFRS and the UL search data that will enhance victim survivability.
