



## Training Mayday! I Was Not Ready For This!

This two-hour virtual presentation will draw from Captain Ragan Underwood's personal Mayday experience. A year ago, on June 7, 2022, he was taking part in an acquired structure training burn. Several combination and volunteer departments were participating. During the day's final burn, a violent incident transpired, with a violent flow path becoming rapidly established. Capt. Underwood had only a few seconds to move his students to safety. However, he was not able to exit. He quickly found himself trapped and searching for a means of egress, forcing him to call a Mayday. Suddenly, over his lapel microphone, he heard, "Everyone out of the home, it's too far gone." The incident commander made the decision to pull the RIT team out, leaving Capt. Underwood inside the building.

Basic firefighter training does not prepare us for the mental aspects of calling a Mayday, nor does it teach how to fight through the bouts of panic during these events. Please join Capt. Underwood, learn from his experience, and participate in a facilitated discussion.
