



Roadmap to Retirement: Taking Control of Your Finances and Future

The South Carolina Fire Academy is offering an in-person financial success strategies workshop geared toward firefighters who want to take control of their financial future, agency recruit school coordinators, and anyone in emergency services interested in learning more about financial planning. This workshop includes a 2025 update for those preparing to enter retirement.

The goal is for firefighters take control of their personal, professional, and financial future so that when they retire, they can enjoy life after emergency services with a fully-funded retirement plan, based on the strategies and tactics they set up and implement while still on the job. This workshop teaches firefighters how to change the behavioral problems and mindset that lead to overwhelming debt, crippling their ability to be financially independent. For those currently in debt, this workshop walks through the steps on how to wipe it out and regain control of personal finances.

This program covers how to: establish a "Why", set wildly important goals, establish a working budget, run cost analysis on major purchases, live debt-free, manage financial accounts, better understand the 1 percent fund, calculate the value of a pension (PORS/SCRS), invest for the future, become financially independent, how to prepare for retirement, and how to tie it all together to form a personal "Roadmap to Retirement".

This workshop has been delivered to almost 700 first responders across the region, and has been added to multiple recruit programs to provide our firefighters with a financial foundation as they enter the fire service.
