Chairman Jones called the meeting to order. Ed Roper advised that a quorum was present.

Chairman Jones asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the August meeting. Karl Ristow made a motion, Jeff Allen second. Discussion: none. All in favor of accepting the minutes. None opposed. The motion passed.

Chairman Jones asked for reports from the different associations:

SC Firefighters Association – Jonathan Jones

Jones talked with chairing committee to develop legislation as related to training and education. Jones also noted that Jim Bowie has resigned as Director of the Firefighters Association.

SC Fire Chiefs Association – Alan Sistare

Announced that their annual meeting would be later this month.

SC Fire Marshal Association – Phil Elliott

Fall conference will be Nov. 7,8,9.

Public Education Association – Jackie Yates

Conference was in Sept. Many states represented. Offered thanks to the SCFA staff for help with registration process and facility usage.

Industrial Representative – Mike Wirt

2-day conference Oct. 9-10. Association meeting on Oct. 18.

Professional Firefighters - Fred Brandt

Letter from Mike Parrotta, President of SC Union, announcing Fred as the new primary representative for their association. Brandt announced annual meeting Oct. 12 – 13 in N. Charleston.

SC Arson Association – Jeff Allen

Annual conference will start Oct. 22 in Myrtle Beach. Brian Horton will be the new president starting in Jan.

Higher Education - Karl Ristow

Announced the leadership academy with law enforcement has been put on hold.

The executive fire officer program will require a 4 yr degree effective Oct. 1, 2009 in order to be accepted.

We need to find a way to let people know what the executive fire officer program is and how to obtain. Maybe create a brochure to be handed out at the Chief Fire Officer seminar, etc.

SC Society of Fire Service Instructors – Skip Hannon

Annual conference will be Feb. 8-10, 2008 at SCFA.

Standing committee reports

Curriculum – Jonathan Jones

This committee has not met yet. Defer to Russ Friar's update.

<u>Facilities – no representative</u>

This committee has not met yet.

Finance - Dixon Odom

Odom handed a spreadsheet with graphics of review sources.

Superintendent's Report – Ed Roper

Roper handed out and reviewed the SCFA finance report.

Resident Training - Phillip Russell

Russell presented and reviewed Resident Training Report. Russell noted that we have processed 105 ARFF students since the new ARFF prop start up in August. We are expecting 70 more students during Oct.

Curriculum Report - Russ Friar

Friar presented and reviewed the Curriculum Report.

Friar announced that Ray Hoshall has been hired for the new Fire Marshal training coordinator. This is a position that is funded by the SCFA, but reports to the Fire Marshal.

Regional Report

Roper handed out and reviewed the regional report thru July.

John Reich -

Reich gave a report on the break out of monies received from the legislature.

- 1 -- \$650,000 continue State Homeland Security training
- 2 -- \$125,000 validation of USAR
- 3 -- \$50,000 communication training
- 4 -- \$127,000 new tow vehicle to pull lowboy (USAR team)

Reich stated that the VSAFE application web page should be out soon. Grant application will be open for 30 days on line. Hope to offer awards in January. Once the money is released, he will have a press conference.

Old Business

Lavarn Lucas stated his disappointment with OSHA compliance at the last meeting. Double talk with SCFA needs to be touching applicable laws for SC when teaching ICS courses. Reich stated the policy was clarified and has been posted on the Fire Marshal web page under "2-in/2-out". There has been much discussion on 2-in/2-out based on the information give at the last quarterly meeting. There are issues with communication of the law to the fire service. Jones stated that everyone needs to go back to their association if you feel strongly that something more explicit needs to be written in the legislation.

New Business

- A) Arson program executive board met and recommended changes to the by-laws. A vote will be held on Oct. 22. The changes include:
 - 1. any conviction in past for fire related offence
 - 2. will not allow any member to knowingly instruct a class with a student who has an arson conviction.
 - 3. will not knowingly allow a student take courses.
 - 4. ask chapter to include these changes in the requirements to the 2-week arson program.
 - 5. at cut off date of 2-week arson course, have a 3-member committee to conduct back ground checks on all applicants.
 - 6. send out letter thru SCFA to major association outlining the chapter's position.
- B) need legislation for mandated training will probably be unfounded by legislature. Need to look at having SCIAAI funding to pay for training.
- C) need to show a presence at the State House if we want to have laws passed.

The next quarterly committee meeting is scheduled for Jan. 9, 2008 at 10 a.m.




