The Candidate will operate a fire department apparatus, given a predetermined route on a public way that incorporates the maneuvers and features that the driver/operator is expected to encounter during normal operations.

1.	Did the candidate operate the vehicle on a predetermined route in a public way that incorporates the maneuvers and features that the driver/operator is expected to encounter during operations?			
2.	Did the candidate operate the vehicle in compliance with all applicable state and local laws and departmental rules and regulations as defined in AHJ SOGs?			
3.	Did the candidate operate passenger restraint devices by fastening/adjusting seatbelts, inspecting restraint conditions, and looking for fraying and tears?			
4.	Did the candidate verbalize they checked that passengers used restraints?			
5.	Did the candidate verbalize they monitored gauges (fuel, oil, speedometer, battery voltage, etc.)? operate controls (Steering wheel, accelerator, brake pedal, etc.)			
6.	Did the candidate operate controls (Steering wheel, accelerator, brake pedal, etc.)			
7.	Did the candidate maintain control of the vehicle under varying road, weather, traffic volume, adverse environmental, and driving surface conditions defined in AHJ SOGs?

8.	Did the candidate employ defensive driving techniques such as maintaining distance, using signals, checking mirrors, obeying speed limits, etc., to ensure the vehicle remained under control?			
9.	Did the candidate demonstrate the ability to maintain a safe following distance per AHJ SOG? <u>Note:</u> see AHJ SOG for the definition of "safe".			
10.	Did the candidate control the vehicle during acceleration and deceleration?
